THE CIVILISED TOUCH

Second biggest change is the *convertible hood*. You just unclip it and fold it right back into the body. It comes

up just as fast. We have also reshaped the bucket seats and covered them in supple Ambla.

The facia panel now boasts walnut veneer. Liberal padding improves safety and appearance of the facia surround, door waist rails and sun visors. There's door-to-door carpeting.

FAIR WARNING

On a car this fast you need earlywarning equipment. There are longrange horns under the bonnet. A headlamp flasher on the steering column. And new indicator repeaters on the wings. Two-speed windscreen wipers as well.

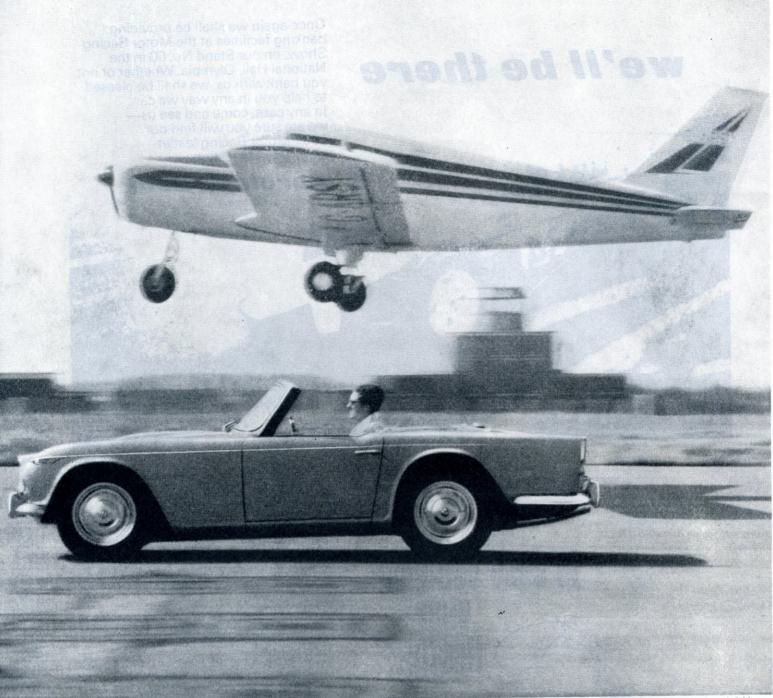

Speed for safety's sake

The top speed of the TR4A is neither here nor there. It is, in fact, about 40-mph more than our present limits here, so you had better save it for there. What is much more relevant to safety is the way the TR4A accelerates. In top gear, it will move from 40-mph to 60-mph in 8.2 seconds. And there's safety in these numbers! This is the acceleration you use to overtake, swiftly and cleanly, without creating ill-will.

Half a dozen other virtues stake the special claim of the TR4A to be a safe car. Front-wheel disc brakes. A low centre of gravity. Exceptionally good visibility for a sports car whether you choose the soft top or hard top. A heavily-padded facia cowl. Rack-and-pinion

steering of utter fidelity. Wide-section tyres for additional contact with the road.

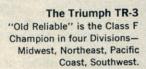

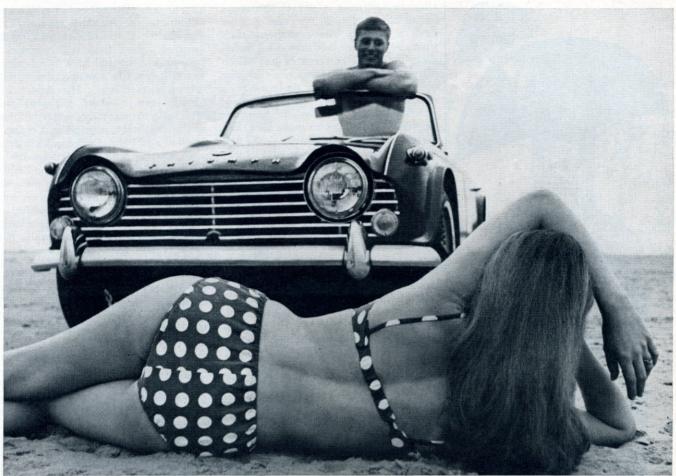
